Overview

Malaria continues to plague vast regions and populations of the world. It is endemic in more than 100 countries and causes at least one million deaths annually. Every hour nearly 100 children around the world die of severe malaria infections, with the vast majority of deaths in sub-Saharan Africa, where Malawi is located. It is estimated that between, 500,000 to 1 million episodes occur each year, imposing a stark human and economic burden on households, communities, and Malawi as a nation.

Target Audience

Scouts Association of Malawi has always priotised vulnerable population in our society that includes the elderly, and people with physical challenges. In this exercise 200 hundred individuals were targeted and due to covid-19 social gathering restrictions a few were gathered and the rest were given in their respective homes.

During the ITNs distribution some issue were uncovered affecting the target audience as the following;

1: Due to different disabilities, unable to do farming to provide for themselves as farming is the only means of survival.

2: People with albinism, unable to socialize due to some insecurities about their lives as it is believed that their bones bring fortune to people. They are confined to their homes in fear of being killed and this affect their education as well.

3: Due to limited sources to acquire finances, most of the elderly and people with physical challenges really on seasonal fruits to sustain them all year around.
